### **SENIOR DUES**

### **GRADUATION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

It is traditional that seniors send announcements of their graduation to family and friends. A representative of Josten's, Inc. will take orders for announcements from 10:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. in the Commons on:

Wed., November 11- for last names A-L

And

Thurs. November 12- for last names M-Z

A \$50 deposit must be made at the time of ordering, or you may pay in full. Very few extra announcements will be available in the spring; therefore, it is important they be ordered on November 11 or 12. Orders will be delivered in April. Instructions for ordering will be given in the class meeting on Nov. 4.

### **CAPS AND GOWNS**

Seniors planning to participate in Commencement MUST order a cap and gown. Orders for caps and gowns will be taken at the same time as those for graduation announcements (see above). You do not need to order announcements to order a cap and gown. Order forms will be distributed during the class meeting on Nov. 4. There is an extra fee for late orders.
