Stow-Munroe Falls High School to serve as new home for summer school

STOW, OHIO—April 22, 2009—Summer school is just around the corner, and students planning to attend can soon begin registration. Stow-Munroe Falls City School District students can register for classes May 11-15, while registration for students enrolled in one of the six-district educational compact schools is May 18-22. All classes will be held at the Stow-Munroe Falls High School.

In addition to traditional summer classes offered for students in grades 7-12, the high school will host classes for students in elementary and middle grades as well.

Session I will be held June 22 to July 10 and Session II will be held July 13 through July 31.

Summer class schedules include physical education, as well as reading, writing and special education classes. Online courses in English, algebra and geometry, history, science and health will also be offered. Required orientation for all online courses is scheduled for June 22.

“The high school will be the main hub for summer school beginning in June,” said Supt. Russ Jones. “In the past students could attend summer classes at both Kimpton Middle School and the high school, but due to cost savings, the high school will house all summer classes.”

Reading and math intervention is available for students currently enrolled in grades K-6. Classes are offered Monday through Thursday, July 6 to July 30, from 9 a.m. until noon. The fee for either class is \$100.

Through a partnership with Kent State University (KSU), first through sixth grade students can participate in a six-week reading and writing tutoring program. No class fee is required as a result of grant funding from KSU. University professors will oversee the tutoring program.

Additionally, SMFCSD will continue to provide extended school year services for special education services for eligible students at the high school.

This year, high school principal, Susan Schur, will oversee the entire summer school, which will eliminate the need for elementary and middle school principals, as well as custodial and building maintenance at the additional building that previously housed summer school.
